1973 SUGGESTED VALUES FOR TAX PURPOSES
ON DONATED BOOKS.

The Oregon State Bar Bulletin issues the above annually and it is something all law librarians should know about. It is of invaluable use when writing the detailed reports of gifts to the library and for donors when gift was for income tax purposes.

This gives suggested values for Jan 1, 1973 and was prepared by the Assessment and Appraisal Division of the Dept of Revenue, State of Oregon in cooperation with the Oregon State Bar. It is in the February 1973 issue of the Oregon State Bar Bulletin.

REPORT ON MORE EFFECTIVE LEARNING.

All learning comes through the senses- we see, hear, smell, feel and taste - and through these experiences we learn.

A Socony-Mobil Oil Company survey showed that:

We learn:

1 per cent by taste
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ percent by touch
3 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent by smell
11 percent by hearing

83 per cent by Sight

The key senses of sight and hearing are used almost exclusively in formal teaching. The survey also showed that:

We retain:

10 per cent of what we read
20 per cent of what we hear
30 per cent of what we see

AND

50 per cent of what we see and hear

These figures provide a good answer to the often comment of:
"Who needs to attend the program? I'll just read the notes
or transcript."

This is the real reason why you should come to Lexington in
October to see and hear and remember.

PILOT PROJECT AND MEETING OF SOUTHEREASTERN
ALL CHAPTER AT MARCO BEACH, FLORIDA.

As our News Letter was going to press we received a letter from Peyton R Neal, Jr. on the above project and quote portions of it for the benefit of ORALL members.

The Information Dynamic Corporation has concluded an agreement with Harvard University, whereby a large portion of the bibliographic data from the Harvard Law Cataloging Department will be captured along with the Marc II format material on Class K from the Library of Congress. This data will be put into the IDC computers and will be made available initially in microform format.

The SE Chapter President Pearl Von Allmen extends an invitation to us to join the chapter for the Marco Beach, Florida meeting on Aug 19th when a formal presentation will be made on the above.

The program will begin with luncheon at 12:30, following brief remarks by Mary Oliver and Edwin Surrency. The IDC people will begin their formal presentation at 2:30. Other participants are Morris Cohen, Ignor Kavass, Peyton Neal, Betty Taylor and Paul Willis.

In addition to discussing the details of the project, the panel will also consider the implications that the mini-computer -- scheduled for use in the second phase of this project -- will have for other law school administrative tasks as well as other Law library tasks, such as budget and fund control, on-order file maintenance, claim and bindery control, and circulation and reserve book functions.

The meeting will be in Marco Beach, Florida, August 18-20, and you should make your arrangements directly. Travel via air will be through Miami Beach with free air taxi connections to Marco Beach.
