OHIO BAR ASSOCIATION LAW LIBRARY COMMITTEE MEETING.

On invitation, your president met with the Library Committee of the Ohio Bar Association on 9-8-73 in Columbus. Fortunately ORALL is ably represented on this active committee by Carol Bratton, Arthur Fiske, Gertrude Johnson, Judge James DeWeese and Evelyn Bachman. The greater portion of the morning was devoted to their Ohio County Law Library survey by Evelyn and the plight of County law Libraries and Librarians in general.

After two requests they received only 26 replies or about 30% so the report is not conclusive. Incidentally ORALL'S records show they only receive about the same number of replies to inquiries.

This means there is much work to be done. They are interested in knowing if ORALL will again combine their forces and talents with them on a betterment program for Ohio County Law Libraries and Librarians and search ways and means to reach this group.

I again quote from ORALL'S Constitution.

"The purpose of this Association shall be to further the development and usefulness of law libraries, the promotion of the growth of law librarianship and the stimulation of a spirit of mutual helpfulness among law libraries in the Ohio Region."

We have a challenge. Are we ready to accept it?

It will not be easy. But it is necessary.

We are open to suggestions from our members on this timely subject. Let us hear from you.

This move might sound a bit drastic, but it has been intended to save the Association from financial catastrophe. Could you continue in business if your income were reduced by 66 2/3%? You could not, and neither can the Ohio Regional Association of Law Libraries. Only 1/3 of the persons listed in our 1973 OR'LL Directory have paid their year's dues!

We apologize for any possible mistakes made in the second billing to OR'LL's membership. It is not our purpose to offend anyone but to help everyone by saving our Association.

Just in 1973 we have accomplished, or have in progress, the following:

1. Have prepared and mailed an Ohio Regional Association Law Library 1973 Directory, a comprehensive reference tool.
2. Have mailed six (6) improved and fully informative News Letters to all persons in the 1973 Directory.
3. Have prepared the now famous model Ohio Bibliography which has been printed and distributed for us by the Ohio Bar Assoc.
4. Have a project of microforming all the Ohio Supreme Court Decisions and Briefs under progress.
5. Are considering a project to have the Ohio Attorney General's Opinions printed and distributed promptly.
6. Have formed an active committee to investigate the possibility of compiling a much needed Union List for Law Libraries in this region.
7. OR'LL has made possible for all County Law Libraries to receive copies of all House and Senate bills as they are passed and printed.
8. Each issue of OR'LL News Letter contains important timely information on available positions in libraries of this area. This section of the News Letters helps the Law Librarians to find information on positions and librarians available.
9. OR'LL has a very active Legislative Committee which keeps an observant eye on the introduced Ohio House and Senate Bills, and which helps to pass favorable bills to Law Librarians in this region as well as help to fight those detrimental to our cause.

The above are just but a few of the projects and accomplishments which OR'LL has done or is attempting in 1973. There are even more goals for 1974....!

We would also like to remind you of the following:

- a) If you work in a firm, business, or school law library, and you are paying OR'LL's fees, check with your parent organization to see if they can do for you and yours what most already do: have them pay OR'LL dues.
