
palatial University of Dayton School of Law Library. Director Tom Hanley and staff will provide the commentary and delight comrades and colleagues with tales of his "moving experience."

# FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR COUNTY LAW LIBRARY ASSOCIATIONS IN OHIO FACES A POTENT LEGISLATIVE ENCOUNTER

Less than a skirmish, but more than a challenge, the law librarians and officers who serve Ohio's eighty-eight counties are marshaling forces and arguments which can be used to prevail over what has been described as "the most serious attack, ever" on the existence of the time honored "courthouse library."

Stemming from a mandate of the Supreme Court, the Ohio Sentencing Commission has been charged with, among other things, revising the state's misdemeanor sentencing laws. A primary issue under scrutiny is the redistribution of traffic fines and the consequent effect on the funds directed to county law library associations (O.R.C. 3375.50 - 3375.53).

The Commission has established a Fine Distribution Committee to study and recommend an alternate source of funding for county law libraries. This Committee has met monthly since the first of the year and has covered the issues of accountability, management, public access, cost effective resource sharing, public versus private funding, as well as the role of the law library in courthouse activities and county government as a whole.

Bluntly stated, the Commission is not convinced that quasi public money such as traffic fines should be used to support an institution that serves the needs of attorneys primarily from the private sector.

It is the Fine Distribution Committee's recommendation that the current funding statutes be replaced by provisions that require an increase in the filing fees for all cases, civil and criminal, filed in all courts within a county. This additional fee would be designated for the operation and maintenance of a county law library. The amounts under consideration are a minimum of \$10.00 per civil case and a minimum of \$5.00 per criminal case, allowing for higher fees if necessary.

At the minimum levels, this arrangement

would result in an increase of funds for slightly over one-half of the county law libraries and a decrease for the others. Needless to say, the issue of such a disparity is difficult to resolve. Add to this the apparent concern of county officials over the accountability factor, or lack thereof, of these law libraries which are primarily autonomous and subject to only periodic state audits and the prospect of a complete revamping of these institutions does not seem out of the realm of possibility.

As of this writing, the draft legislation had not yet been approved by the Ohio Sentencing Commission and has not yet been endorsed by the Ohio State Bar Association. Jan Ryan Novak, Director of The Cleveland Law Library Association, is the current Chair of the Ohio State Bar Association's Law Libraries and Legal Information Services Committee and regularly attends the meetings of the Fine Distribution Committee as an active participant. She will meet with the OSBA Board of Governors in July to ask for their support in ensuring adequate funding for county law libraries.

As the history of most successful institutions reflects both growth and change, the structure and governance of Ohio's county law libraries may be no different. These associations are an important link in each county's justice system and provide unique services to the law library field by building and maintaining an in depth practitioners' library which enhances the resources of both law firm libraries and law school libraries.

A moral victory will not be enough. It is vital that both the Fine Distribution Committee and the Ohio Sentencing Commission be convinced of the importance of county law libraries and be conscious of their duty to provide for and empower these libraries to perform to the expectations of the twenty-first century.


